INC. VILLAGE OF EAST WILLISTON
AGENDA MEETING
MONDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2014

Agenda Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, October 27, 2014 at 7:30 p.m. at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

There were present: Mayor David E. Tanner, Trustees Bonnie L.S. Parente, Caroline DeBenedittis, Christopher A. Siciliano, Robert Vella, Village Attorney Jeffrey Blinkoff, Village Clerk Marie Hausner, Bonnie Kreisman, Secretary to the Board of Trustees, Village Treasurer Michael Delury.

Also present: Robert Campagna, John Mirando, Paul Granger.

Trustee Siciliano stated that the head of buildings and grounds of North Side School met with James Bailey of Public Works and advised that they will be removing 15 trees from the school property. The trees are located on the ball field and the parking lot. They are Norway maples and have been dead for some time. The school will replace the trees in the spring.

The Mayor asked the clerk to advise Phil Chappo of what Trustee Siciliano reported.

Trustee Siciliano stated that public works has begun replacing the sign posts and signs in the southwest quadrant. The construction of the post is common cedar. It was found that the old sign posts rot out at the base.

Trustee Vella stated that the James Bailey should look into putting some type of treatment on the base of the posts prior to installation.

Mayor Tanner felt that the Village should get something nicer than the common cedar post that will last the same amount of time.

Mayor Tanner asked that Michael Delury meet with assessor candidate Mark Davella to go over the Village's needs and discuss costs of Mr. Davella's services.

Jeffrey Blinkoff stated that he will be going back to court on the 8 Sumter Avenue letter on October 29th, as the case was postponed on the 20th because papers were not filed. It was noted that all structures on the property are to be demolished.

Bonnie Kreisman noted that when potential buyers of 8 Sumter Avenue came to the Village office and met with building inspector Robert Campagna, he advised them that if the sale of the property does go through, and they do not demolish the house, they must secure the roof immediately.

On the motion of Trustee Parente, seconded by Trustee DeBenedittis, the Board moved to adjourn into executive session at 8:21 p.m. to discuss proposed water system design and a conditional use permit application at the Wheatley Hills Golf Club, 147 East Williston Avenue, and an issue of potential litigation.

The Board re-convened at 10:55pm. No action was taken during the executive session.

Mr. Campagna distributed a copy of a petition forwarded from resident Frank Suppa requesting that the Board consider changing the Village Code to allow residents to widen their driveways (since there is no overnight parking on Village streets).

Mr. Campagna stated he has spoken to the building inspector from Garden City on the subject. The Board asked that Mr. Campagna consult with the Board of Zoning Appeals on the subject to find out what their views are on the matter.

There being no further business, on the motion of Mayor Tanner , seconded by Trustee Parente, the meeting was adjourned at 11:04pm.
