**AGENDA MEETING**  
**MONDAY, NOVEMBER 28, 2022**

Agenda meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, November 28, 2022 at 7:00 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

Mayor Parente thanked Trustee Raffaella Dunne for all of efforts in making the Turkey Trot 5K race a success.

She noted that the volunteers for the various committees to decorate the village hall for the holidays were not coordinated.

Mayor Parente asked that Ms. Kreisman reach out to the Fosters to ask them to organize the Doggiepalozza for next year.

Mayor Parente stated that Christmas photos should take place in December 2023, and that the office should contact "Jocelyn".

**RESOLUTION 2022-33 – A RESOLUTION TO INCREASE THE SALARY TO THE MAYOR AND TRUSTEES IN JUNE 2023 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$15,000 PER YEAR FOR THE MAYOR AND \$7,500 PER YEAR FOR EACH TRUSTEE**

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Iannone, the Board approved a resolution to increase the salary for the mayor and trustees in June 2023 in the amount of \$15,000 for the mayor per year and \$7,500 for each trustee per year.

**RESOLUTION 2022-34 – A RESOLUTION APPOINTING GEORGE CARLIN AS A MEMBER OF THE EAST WILLISTON BOARD OF FIRE COMMISSIONERS**

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Iannone, the Board approved a resolution appointing George Carlin as a member of the East Williston Board of Fire Commissioners.

Mayor Parente asked that Ms. Kreisman check with the village clerk on the employment status of Deborah DaSilva.

Mayor Parente asked that the resumes for the public works position be sent to Trustees Iannone and Lark.

Ms. Kreisman was asked to resend the surveillance camera link to Trustees Dunne and Lark.

Mayor Parente wanted all future regular Board meetings to commence at 7:30pm.

Mayor Parente asked for the status of the permit for 14 Post Lane from Jared Mandel.

Ms. Kreisman asked the Board about the senior citizen exemption data that she had sent to them.

The East Williston Fire Department asked for a deadline to place a referendum on the March 2023 ballot, but no further information has been forwarded.

Mr. Blinkoff stated that there is a January – March deadline.

Ms. Kreisman was asked to scan the BSA invitations to Mayor Parente.

Mr. Blinkoff stated that the Muzio matter remains on appeal.

Mayor Parente was approached by resident Rita Botensten of a new scam where criminals are approaching delivery trucks when packages arrive and take the packages. She will put this into her December letter to residents.

The Board did not approve a waiver for the new water meter at the Martone residence at 146 Charles St.

Ms. Kreisman was asked to forward her salary needs to the Board so it could be reviewed.

There being no further business, on the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Dunne, the meeting was adjourned at 8:24pm.
