Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, December 12, 2022 at 7:30 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

**RESOLUTION #2022-35 A RESOLUTION INTRODUCING A LOCAL LAW AMENDING SECTION 109-20 OF THE VILLAGE CODE ENTITLED "CLEAR-SIGHT TRIANGLE"**

On the motion Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Dunne, and with Mayor Parente and Trustees Dunne, Iannone, and Lark voting "aye" the Board approved a resolution introducing a local law amending Section 109-20 of the Village Code entitled "Clear-Sight Triangle" as follows:

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees recognizes the public interest is served by ensuring that the view of operators of motor vehicles at intersections is not obstructed by trees or other vegetative growth, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has determined that amending Section 109-20 of the Village Code in order to clarify what precautions are required with respect to plantings that may potentially obstruct the view of the operators of motor vehicles at intersections.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That a public hearing to consider a local law amending the Village Code section 109-20 with respect to the proper maintenance of such trees and vegetative growth on corner lots shall be introduced before the Board of Trustees at a meeting to be held on January 9, 2023 at 7:30pm in the Village Hall at 2 Prospect Street, East Williston NY 11596

AND IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED,

That the Village Clerk shall publish and post notice of the same as required.

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Dunne, and with Trustees Dunne, Iannone, and Lark all voting “aye”, the Board unanimously approved the abstract of claims for November 2022.

### **TRUSTEE REPORTS**

#### **MAYOR BONNIE L.S. PARENTE**

Mayor Parente thanked Henry Yuen and the Tzu Chi Youth Orchestra for performing after the Christmas tree lighting on December 6<sup>th</sup>. She stated that the music was beautiful and enjoyed by all who attended.

#### **DEPUTY MAYOR/TRUSTEE RAFFAELA DUNNE**

Deputy Mayor Dunne stated the Recreation Committee is still looking for someone who can lead the committee and become its chairperson. If anyone is interested, they should email the village office with their contact information.

She further noted that the Beautification Committee is looking for members who will volunteer to decorate the interior of the village hall during the holidays.

Trustee Dunne stated that the annual tree lighting was a success, especially with the Tzu Chi Youth Orchestra playing holiday music in the village hall.

#### **TRUSTEE JAMES IANNONE**

The Village Justice Court for November 2022 reported nine parking violations, five moving violations and no village code violations, with \$3,015.00 total fines collected, \$404.00 in New York State surcharges.

The East Williston Senior Group will on Thursday, December 15, 2022 at 1pm with entertainment by Tom and Angela Stallone. Lunch and dessert will be served. The Senior Group will meet again on January 19<sup>th</sup>.

#### **TRUSTEE JAMES LARK**

Trustee Lark stated that it would be hard to top the season that the East Williston Little League had in 2022. He further noted that registration for Spring 2023 is now open.

Trustee Lark stated that the department of public works is awaiting delivery of its new tractor.

Lastly, the Beautification Committee is still looking for volunteers for spring clean up and planting, as well as decorating the interior of the village hall during the holiday season.

**TRUSTEE ANTHONY GALLO**

Trustee Gallo stated that the East Williston Fire Department answered a total of 10 calls during the month of November 2022: two general alarms, three mutual aid calls to neighboring fire departments and five EMS calls.

Trustee Gallo thanked the members of the Department of helping out at the Christmas tree lighting.

**VILLAGE CLERK MARIE L. HAUSNER**

The police report for November 2022 was not received in the time for the meeting.

A glitch in the Clearforms system prevented the building department report from being created.

The village office will be closed on Monday, December 26 and Monday, January 2, 2023.

Eswar Sivarraman stated that the energy exuded by the members, coaches and families of the East Williston Little League was heartwarming. He noted that the email blast did not mention the proclamation presentation, and hoped that future events like this will be noted.

There being no further business, on the motion of Trustee Dunne , seconded by Trustee Gallo, the meeting was adjourned at 8:52pm.
