INC. VILLAGE OF EAST WILLISTON
FEBRUARY 25, 2013
AGENDA MEETING

Agenda Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on February 25, 2013 at 7:30p.m. At the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

There were present: Mayor David E. Tanner, Trustees Bonnie Parente, Caroline DeBenedittis, Robert M. Vella, Jr., Christopher Siciliano Village Attorney Jeffrey L. Blinkoff, Village Treasurer Michael Delury, Secretary to the Board of Trustees Bonnie Kreisman, Marie Hausner, Village Clerk.

The Board received a request from the Town of North Hempstead for the institution of parking restrictions on Sagamore Avenue in front of the ball field gates, so equipment can be unloaded and brought into the park for field maintenance. The Clerk was asked to contact the Town to see if they can narrow down the days and times when the field maintenance can take place so the parking restrictions will not be too tight.

RESOLUTION #8-2013 A RESOLUTION APPROVING LOCAL LAW NO. 1-2013 AMENDING VILLAGE CODE SECTION 11-12 THROUGH 11-19 PERTAINING TO GARAGE SALES.

On the motion of Trustee Vella, seconded by Trustee Parente, and with Mayor Tanner and Trustees Parente, DeBenedittis, Siciliano and Vella voting "aye", the Board authorized the following resolution:

WHEREAS, a proposed Local Law was previously presented to the Board as Local Law Number 1 of the Year 2013 and was passed before the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston, and

WHEREAS, the Local Law amends the portion of the Village Code pertaining to garage sales as set forth in sections 11-12 through 11-19 of the Village Code, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds this action necessary to maintain the best interest of the residents of the Village and to protect the public welfare, and

WHEREAS, public notice with respect to the proposed Local Law has been provided, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has determined that it is the lead agency for the purposes of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, ("SEQRA"), and has further determined that the consideration of the within Local Law is a Type Two action having no significant effect upon the environment and requiring no further action under SEQRA, and

NOW THEREFORE, it is resolved that Local Law Number 1-2013 be and the same hereby is approved.

Mayor Tanner stated that representative from DeJana Industries and Meadow Carting has been asked to attend the public hearing on the sanitation bid on Monday, March 11, 2013 at 8:00 p.m. Each was asked to give a presentation on their efforts to adhere to the recycling regulations.

Trustee Vella stated that the office should keep a list of all future complaints and email the problem to the service representative at DeJana so the complaint can be in record and a permanent record.

Mayor Tanner asked for a list of complaints received from residents about DeJana.

Mr. Blinkoff addressed properties with continuing violations. He spoke with Building Inspector Robert Campagna about putting a system in place where when two violations (summonses) are issued when a resident does not comply immediately on a matter, a legally worded letter needs to be sent in between the violations to the resident.

Mr. Blinkoff further stated that two cases regarding the removal of trees will be coming before the Village Court in March, one located on Meritoria Drive and the other on Ludwig Lane.

Trustee DeBenedittis stated that when she attended the recent NYCOM conference, they advised Village officials to have individual, Village "issued" email addresses for Village business.

Trustee DeBenedittis that the Recreation Committee has moved the Cinco de Mayo celebration on the Village Green to Saturday, May 4th, rather than the Friday night first suggested. The Committee was looking to hold a children's event on the Village Green the night before. The annual concert on the Green will be held on May 22nd at pm.

Trustee Siciliano stated that the issue of the construction of the antique truck building will be brought up before the entire Fire Department membership at the April 2013 meeting.

On the motion of Trustee Vella, seconded by Trustee Siciliano and with Mayor Tanner and Trustees DeBenedittis, Siciliano and Vella all voting "aye", there being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:50 p.m.
