AGENDA MEETING
MONDAY, AUGUST 1, 2022

Agenda meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Tuesday, July 26, 2022 at 7:30 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

There were present: Mayor Bonnie L.S. Parente, Trustees Raffaella Dunne, James Iannone, Anthony Gallo, Secretary to the Board of Trustees Bonnie Kreisman.

Absent from meeting: James Lark, Trustee, Marie Hausner, Village Clerk, William Basel, Deputy Village Clerk, Michael Delury, Treasurer

Initial discussion about permanently changing agenda meetings to begin at 7:00 pm not 7:30pm. All members of the board were happy with idea. Will confirm with Mr. Blinkoff to make sure it does not conflict with his schedule.

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Iannone, the Board moved to adjourn into executive session at 7:05pm to discuss potential legal matters.

The Board reconvened at 7:33pm. No decision was made during the executive session.

Mayor Parente asked for an update on the camera installation.

Approximately 95% complete. There was a question of whether a link on the website would be beneficial for public streets. No decision made.

Meeting was interrupted due to multiple fire calls regarding the smell of gas throughout the village. Patrick Theodore called the Mayor. Trustee Iannone went to the firehouse. It was determined that National Grid's subcontractor was performing an odorization test.

The Mayor contacted National Grid and an email blast was sent out and Facebook page was updated

Ms. Kreisman was directed to work with building inspector Jared Mandel regarding an unstable pergola at 14 Post Lane.

Mayor Parente brought up obtaining an email address for the security officer. It was determined that Gmail would be the best source for the new email.

Mayor Parente requested an update on the building department sorting process and the work of the interns.

Ms. Kreisman responded that it is going slower than Jared thought it would, but going along with Nassau County youth interns turned out to be less reliable than village interns who were interns moving along nicely.

The Board brought up the subject of EV chargers in the village parking lot. The issue will be discussed at a later date as important issues (such as placement) needed to be examined. The chargers will not necessarily help businesses in East Williston since we don't have any.

LIRR buses have been parking in the parking lot with their exhaust pipes backed up to the toddler park bus drivers do not take heed from the Mayor, security officer, or secretary to board of trustees The Mayor said she will contact the LIRR.

Mayors states that the road plates at Roslyn Road by William Street have been blocked off and as soon as they were blocked off further complaints arose

Trustee Gallo asked that Simon look at the sidewalk at the corner of Donald Street and Roslyn Road. About 50 feet on Donald Street seem to need repair

The Mayor asked for an update on Springbrook. She was advised the financial side is moving along but slowly. The water billing module cannot be started until financial side is stable.

Trustee Iannone was asked about the August 31 pediatric gold tree lighting and whether he spoke to resident Anthony Leva. Trustee Iannone said Mr. Leva is still raw and wants to think about it

Mayor Parente asked if other the other speed bumps were installed by public works. There was no information available.

Also an update on the AED's was needed. The Board was advised that the village hall batteries and pads are awaiting quotes. Trustee Gallo will follow up with Tom McCauley on the East Williston Little League's device.

Mayor Parente said she will speak to Mike Delury directly regarding radio room grant

A question was raised about the new fire truck being purchased from Syosset Fire District. Also, the board will get an update from Pat Theodore regarding the old truck, which will be going to Chile.

The Mayor advised board of the Meadow Carting/Omni agreement discussion ensued all agreed the contract should be signed.

Trustee Dunne stated that the village hall needs painting. Quotes should be obtained for wherever there are scuff marks.

Trustee Gallo stated that there is work occurring at 171 Bengeyfield Drive before regulated hours on Saturdays. Ms. Kreisman will advise Mary Bishop to be present on Saturday awaiting the start of the work to issue a court appearance ticket.
