Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, August 9, 2021 at 7:30 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

On the motion of Trustee Lark, seconded by Trustee Dunne, and with Mayor Parente and Trustees Dunne and Lark all voting "aye", the Board authorized the Mayor to sign the County of Nassau Consultant's, Contractor's and vendor's disclosure form as one of the items requested as part of the Radio Room Upgrade.

TRUSTEE REPORTS

DEPUTY MAYOR/TRUSTEE RAFFAELA DUNNE

Trustee Dunne reported that the Library is continuing its Wednesday family evening events.

The Recreation Committee has scheduled the children and adult tent parties on the village green September 17th and 18th. The village-wide tag sale is scheduled for Saturday, September 25th with a rain date of September 26th.

TRUSTEE JAMES IANNONE

Trustee Iannone was excused from the meeting. In his absence the clerk gave the report of the Village Justice Court for July 2021. One parking ticket was received and seven parking tickets were disposed with fines collected in the amount of \$975.00.

The East Williston Senior Group is on hiatus for the summer.

TRUSTEE JAMES LARK

Trustee Lark reported that the East Williston Little League made it to the sectionals and were having much success.

The Devlin Field parking lot was refurbished through an Eagle Scout project.

The Beautification Committee had been planting late summer flowers around the village hall, and green area.

A new employee in the department of public works started today, put the staff number back up to three persons.

TRUSTEE ANTHONY GALLO

Trustee Gallo was excused from the meeting. In his absence, Mayor Parente presented the East Williston Fire Department for July 2021. The department responded to a total of 18 calls. Eight mutual aid calls, five general alarms, and five ambulance calls.

The East Williston Fire Department was still responding to calls in Williston Park.

MAYOR BONNIE L.S. PARENTE

Mayor Parente stated that the Village will host a tree lighting on the Village Green on Tuesday, August 31st at 7:30pm in observance of Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month which starts September 1st.

The Village will also hold a ceremony for the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on Saturday, September 11th at 7pm on the Village Green.

VILLAGE CLERK MARIE L. HAUSNER

The police report from the Nassau County Police Department Third Precinct for July 2021 had not been received in time for the meeting.

The Building Department Report for the month of July 2021: 17 Post Avenue, installation of driveway. 10 Griffin Lane, legalize and maintain porch. 19 Donald Street, install a pergola. 75 East Williston Avenue, install a shed. 157 Charles Street, construction of driveway and patio.

16 Orchard Meadow Road, legalize and maintain exterior stairs. 41 Sumter Avenue, installation of a patio, 46 Orchard Drive, relocate two air conditioning units, install driveway and curbing and construct patios and exterior basement entry.

The Mayor opened the meeting to residents.

Michael Guglielmo stated he was happy to hear of the success and great interest in the East Williston Little League.

He also stated that the speed sign on Roslyn road upon entering the village from the north is blocked by tree limbs. He asked if the department of public works could trim the branch so that the speed sign could be seen by drivers.

He thought that the village should get another sign like this sign as it will be helpful for drivers to know they are exceeding the speed limit.

It was noted that the sign in question was obtained from the Town of North Hempstead through a grant they received.

Mayor Parente stated that she met with Assemblyman Ra about lowering the state speed limit for villages.

Mr. Guglielmo asked when National Grid will be completing their work on Roslyn Road, south of East Williston Avenue.

Mayor Parente stated that National Grid hoped to have the work completed by August 15th, with odorization of the gas line taking place shortly thereafter.

Mr. Blinkoff stated that there is no update on the court case involving the fence at the North Side School.

There being no further business, on the motion of Trustee Dunne, seconded by Trustee Lark, the meeting was adjourned at 8:21 pm
