APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A motion to approve the minutes of the August 14, 2023 regular Board of Trustees meeting was made by Deputy Mayor Iannone, seconded by Trustee Dunne. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

A motion to approve the minutes of the August 28, 2023 Board of Trustees agenda meeting was made by Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Gallo. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

MOTIONS

A motion to approve the Abstract of Audited Vouchers dated September 11, 2023 was made by Deputy Mayor Iannone and seconded by Trustee Lark. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

A motion to authorize the East Williston Village Court to apply for a JCAP grant in the 2023-2024 cycle up to \$30,000.00 was made by Trustee Gallo and seconded by Trustee Dunne. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

A motion to approve the use of the Nassau County Planning Commission guidelines for the streamlining of zoning referrals was made by Mayor Parente and seconded by Deputy Mayor Iannone. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

A motion that pursuant to General Municipal Law section 200-AA the Board of Trustees approve \$1,000.00 stipends for firefighters who participate in EMS training and obtain their certification or recertification was made by Deputy Mayor Iannone and seconded by Mayor Parente. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

A motion to approve a block party request submitted by the residents of Ludwig Street for October 28, 2023 (Rain date October 29) was made by Deputy Mayor Iannone and seconded by Trustee Dunne. **The motion was passed unanimously.**

REPORTS

MAYOR BONNIE PARENTE

Mayor Parente thanked everyone for coming to the 9/11 Memorial Ceremony this evening and the Pediatric Cancer Gold Tree Lighting last week.

She also stated that the Village has recently received a lot of grants for improvement, avoiding the need for these costs to be shouldered by the residents. The recent grants include Fire Department Improvement Grants and JCAP grant for Court improvements.

The Mayor advised that the Holiday Tree Lighting will take place on Friday, December 1, 2023.

DEPUTY MAYOR JAMES IANNONE

Deputy Mayor Iannone presented the Village Justice Court report for August; he reported a total of 41 violations, including 32 parking violations and 9 moving violations. He also reported there were 14 parking violations disposed and 2 moving violations. Total monies collected was \$2,243.00.

He also reported that the East Williston Senior Group will resume their monthly meetings on September 21st at 1pm; food and entertainment is provided and he encouraged all seniors to attend or to invite friends and family to participate. He also advised that the Senior Group's Halloween Party meeting will be held on October 19, 2023.

TRUSTEE RAFFAELA DUNNE

Trustee Dunne reported that the library's information sessions will be held on October 11, November 8, and December 6 covering the topics of lowering prescription drug costs, senior scams, and Medicare information. She advised that further information could be found in the Village flyer packets and on the library website.

The village-wide tag sale is scheduled for Saturday October 14th and that Pickleball is starting September 21.

TRUSTEE JAMES LARK

Trustee Lark reported that East Williston Little League unfortunately, like many, has had to reschedule some games due to high heat days and inclement weather. The EWLL will be holding its annual golf outing on October 16.

The beautification committee was out today starting their fall cleanup and beautification with the help of new Village employee Daniel Melore.

TRUSTEE ANTHONY GALLO

Trustee Gallo presented the Fire Department report that the department responded to 14 calls, including 6 medical calls, 2 general calls, 4 fire calls, and 2 mutual aid calls.

He also advised that the Fire Department roof repair was delayed a day due to weather, and would take commence on Thursday, September 13.

VILLAGE CLERK JOANNA E. PALUMBO

Village Clerk Palumbo presented to the Board the Nassau County Police Department report for August, which included 2 auto accidents (one resulting in three injuries), 8 aided cases, & 1 non-auto-related larceny.

She provided the Board with the building department report, which included 8 building permits issued in August.

The next regular meeting of the Board of Trustees is scheduled for Tuesday, October 17, 2023 due to the holiday observance on October 9.

The Mayor opened the meeting to public comment.

Dolores Sedacca advised that she spoke with the Town of North Hempstead Supervisor and was looking for update on the dog park. She was advised by Trustee Lark that it was his understanding that the scout is considering other options for her Gold Award project.

Ms. Sedacca also asked for clarification on the Motion regarding the Nassau County Planning Commission guidelines for the streamlining of zoning referrals. Village Attorney Jeffrey Blinkoff, Esq. explained that the Nassau County Planning Commission had recently implemented a streamlined zoning referral system wherein Villages could proceed without specific written "no jurisdiction letters" from the County.

Michael Guglielmo asked if there was a rain date for the Village tag sale and Mayor Parente explained that there was no rain date because in the past it has caused too much confusion within the Village.

Mayor Parente advised that former Mayor Nancy Zolezzi was honored as a Woman of Distinction by New York State Assemblyman Ed Ra and that she had the honor of attending the ceremony in support of former Mayor Zolezzi.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made at 8:50pm by Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Dunne and the motion was passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE USE OF THE NASSAU COUNTY PLANNING COMMISSION GUIDELINES FOR THE STREAMLINING OF ZONING REFERRALS

WHEREAS, The Board of Trustees ("Board") recognizes that certain matters are to be referred for consideration by the Nassau County Planning Commission in accord with General Municipal Law 239-m, and

WHEREAS, the Board is also aware that the Nassau County Planning Commission has establishes a streamlined process for the referral of many such matters upon an agreement being executed between the Village and the County, and

WHEREAS, the Board believes such an agreement will serve the best interest of the Village and its residents,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Village will participate in the streamlined process, and

That the Mayor is authorized to execute such agreement identified above and as attached here, and the Village Clerk is then empowered to forward the Agreement in accord with its terms for execution on behalf of the County, and

That upon such agreement being executed in full, the Village will proceed in accord with the guidelines as are annexed to this Resolution as to matters requiring referral to the Nassau County Planning Commission.
