**REGULAR MEETING**  
**MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 13, 2021**

Regular Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, September 13, 2021 at 7:30 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

There were present: Mayor Bonnie L.S. Parente, Trustees James Iannone, James Lark and Anthony Gallo, Village Clerk Marie L. Hausner, Village Attorney Jeffrey Blinkoff.

Also present: Harry Yuen, Michael Guglielmo.

On the motion of Trustee Lark, seconded by Trustee Gallo, and with Mayor Parente and Trustees Iannone, Lark and Gallo all voting "aye", the Board approved the minutes the regular meeting of August 9, 2021.

On the motion of Trustee Gallo, seconded by Trustee Lark, and with Mayor Parente and Trustees Iannone, Lark and Gallo all voting "aye", the Board approved the minutes of the agenda meeting of August 30, 2021.

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Iannone and with Mayor Parente and Trustees Iannone, Lark and Gallo all voting "aye", the Board unanimously approved the abstract of claims for August 2021 (20210073- 20210116).

**TRUSTEE REPORTS**

**DEPUTY MAYOR/TRUSTEE RAFFAELA DUNNE**

Trustee Dunne was excised from the meeting.

**MAYOR BONNIE L.S. PARENTE**

Mayor Parente stated that the tree lighting (in gold lights) for Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month took place on the Village Green on August 31<sup>st</sup>. For anyone who purchased lanterns, they are reminded to light them on the evening of September 18<sup>th</sup>.

The village also hosted the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the events of 9/11 with a candlelight ceremony on the village green on September 11<sup>th</sup>.

Mayor Parente reported that street lights along Feather Lane have been repaired. Damage to underground wiring was found to be the cause of the outage.

It was also reported that sidewalk flags on Donald Street will be repaired when a sufficient number of flags throughout the village can be accumulated for cost savings by the contractor submitting a proposal on the replacement.

**TRUSTEE JAMES IANNONE**

The Village Justice Court for August 2021 reported no parking tickets, six moving violations and one code ordinance violation. \$200.00 in fines were collected.

The East Williston Senior Group will meet on September 23<sup>rd</sup> with entertainment by Tom and Angela Stallone. Pizza and desert will be served.

**TRUSTEE JAMES LARK**

Trustee Lark reported that the East Williston Little League's fall season is in full swing.

There were no major items to report regarding the Department of Public Works or the Beautification Committee.

**TRUSTEE ANTHONY GALLO**

Trustee Gallo presented the East Williston Fire Department for August 2021. The department responded to a total of 17 calls. Eight fire calls, two ambulance calls, and seven mutual aid calls.

National Grid is awaiting word on when Nassau County will commence the paving of Roslyn Road.

**VILLAGE CLERK MARIE L. HAUSNER**

The police report from the Nassau County Police Department Third Precinct report for July 2021 cited no auto accidents, five aided cases. No reports of burglary, robbery or criminal mischief. No moving violations and two parking violations were issued.

The police report for August cited one auto accident, three aided cases, no reports of burglary, robbery or criminal mischief, six moving violations and no parking violations were issued.

The Mayor opened the meeting to residents.

Michael Guglielmo asked if there was any update on the court case regarding the proposed fence around the North Side School.

Mr. Blinkoff stated that there is no update on the court case involving the fence at the North Side School. No future arguments have been scheduled.

Mr. Guglielmo asked about the Board's intention to install speed bumps in various locations.

Mr. Blinkoff stated that the village cannot reduce the village-wide speed limit below 30 miles per hour without legislation approved by the New York State Legislature.

Mayor Parente and others had met with State Assemblyman Ed Ra about this matter back in the summer.

Mayor Parente also stated that she was in contact with Nassau County Legislator Rich Nicoletto about the possibility of installing a pedestrian strip along Roslyn Road when it is repaved. He is taking this matter up with the Nassau County Department of Public Works.

There being no further business, on the motion of Trustee Iannone, seconded by Trustee Gallo, the meeting was adjourned at 8:23 pm
