AGENDA MEETING
MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 19, 2022

Agenda meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Incorporated Village of East Williston was held on Monday, September 19, 2022 at 7:00 pm at the Village Hall, 2 Prospect Street, East Williston, New York.

There were present: Mayor Bonnie L.S. Parente, Trustees Raffaella Dunne, James Iannone, Anthony Gallo, Village Clerk Marie Hausner, Deputy Clerk William Basel, Secretary to the Board of Trustees Bonnie Kreisman, Village Attorney Jeffrey Blinkoff.

Excused from meeting: Trustee James Lark, Michael Delury, Treasurer

Trustee Gallo gave a brief demonstration of the EMF meter (electro-magnetic field) purchased by the village.

Mayor Parente wanted the Department of Public Works to take readings at the corner of Roslyn Road and East Williston Avenue three times per day and record the readings while the NYPA powerline installation project is undertaking. The clerk will prepare a form to record the readings.

Mayor Parente advised that Simon Blanco aided the Village of Williston Park in sweeping Hillside Avenue prior and subsequent to the street fair on September 18, 2022. Williston Park's sweeper was broken.

Mayor Parente advised that the new (used) fire truck (2007 Pierce Pumper) has been received from the Syosset Fire Department. She was advised that there is a "number 7" on the vehicle, so the department will most likely add an "81" in front of it and designate the truck as 817.

Mayor Parente questioned progress on Springbrook with regard to utility billing.

Ms. Kreisman stated that they will be starting migration in October. The October water billing will still be generated from the KVS system.

Mayor Parente was still awaiting the link to the security cameras from Wireman Inc.

Mayor Parente asked if Jared Mandel has reviewed the work at the property at 14 Post Lane. She said she will ask him about this issue.

Mayor Parente wanted an email blast sent out to residents advising them of the new email to report security concerns to the village.

The clerk will prepare the wording and pass it by the mayor.

Mayor Parente stated that the proposed local law on lowering the village wide speed limit to 25 miles per hour is on hold until the traffic study is received from Nelson & Pope.

Mayor Parente stated that there was an issue September 17th with National Grid closing streets near Hewlett Drive during the tag sale. While the village does not direct the work of National Grid, the village may want to consider holding the annual tag sale every other year.

Mayor Parente discussed wording for revising the Village Code dealing with bushes and corner sight triangles.

Ms. Kreisman had obtained a copy of the Williston Park Village Code which she felt properly addressed the issue (bushes not higher than three feet/bushes ten feet in to the property line).

Mayor Parente advised that East Williston Fire Department received a grant for a fire alarm system in the firehouse. Chief Batterson will not longer be involved in the matter, but fire department member Lee Viola will be taking over that work.

Mayor Parente asked when the temporary speed bumps will be removed.

The clerk advised in early November in the event of an early snow, so as not to damage snow plows.

Mayor Parente questioned the status of the AED in the lobby of the village hall.

Mr. Basel stated that he will follow up on the matter.

On the motion of Mayor Parente, seconded by Trustee Dunne, the Board moved to adjourn into executive at 8:15pm to discuss personnel matters.

The Board reconvened at 8:40pm. No action was taken during the executive session.

There being no further business, on the motion of Trustee Iannone, seconded by Trustee Dunne, the Board moved to adjourn the meeting at 8:45pm.
